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Reading 1 Thessalonians 5:1-11

Now concerning the times and the seasons, brothers and sisters, you do not need to have anything written to you. For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! But you, beloved, are not in darkness, for that day to surprise you like a thief; for you are all children of light and children of the day; we are not of the night or of darkness.

So then let us not fall asleep as others do, but let us keep awake and be sober; for those who sleep sleep at night, and those who are drunk get drunk at night. But since we belong to the day, let us be sober, and put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation. For God has destined us not for wrath but for obtaining salvation through our Lord Jesus Christ, who died for us, so that whether we are awake or asleep we may live with him.

Therefore encourage one another and build up each other, as indeed you are doing.

Here you have what is yours.' ²⁶But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? ²⁷Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. ²⁸So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. ²⁹For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. ³⁰As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'

FIRST READING

Notice that Deborah wisely realizes that this needs gifts other than her own. Her own strategic intelligence will form the plan to focus the attack. Barak's experienced soldiering will carry it out. Deborah knows the importance of bringing together different gifts. She is not in the least threatened by seeking them out. Notice that the same is true of Barak. Maybe that's why she turns to him. These two may well have worked together before. There may be a lot behind the exchange between them in verses 8 and 9. Barak says "If you will go with me, I will go..." And Deborah says "I will surely go with you."

We see it so often in the Bible - the power of combining different gifts. Jesus practises it. St Paul emphasizes it. When different gifts in a congregation are combined, wonderful things can happen.

THE PSALM

To you I lift up my eyes. For the most part in today's society we look at one another on the level. Even when an encounter is, let's say, between a job applicant and an employer, there will be direct eye contact. However the Psalm reminds us that there is One before whom we would be wise to lift our eyes in praise and prayer, and, by implication, before whom we should lower our eyes in humility. That One is God as our personal Lord.

THE SECOND READING

Paula insists that our Lord's promised return will not be some kind of magic event for which the Christian community has only to wait passively. Rather it is an event for which every day of one's life can be a preparation. Paul gives us an image of a christian rising from bed each morning, getting ready to live a new day with a spirit of faith, love and hope, as one might put on one's clothes for the day.

THE HOLY GOSPEL

Living life as it should be lived is a theme that was always near to Jesus' heart. In this parable I hear Him saying to me "Act, risk, venture, try, give yourself rather than hoard yourself". I think the really important part of the parablen is "Take the talent from him and give it to the one with ten talents"...Its among the harshest things Jesus ever said. This parable is not just about little bags of gold. It is about the gift of human life that we all receive and the particular gifts that we all receive with that life. A well known phrase of our own day says what Jesus is saying - use your gifts or lose them. It is about how we use or offer or invest these gifts. It is about the attitude we bring to the living of our lives. Notice how harshly the servant is condemned. We need to remind ourselves this is for something he didn't do! We tend to think that God is exercised about the misdeeds we do. Fact is God may be much more exercised about the worth while deeds we don't do!. Do not be dismayed by the brokenness of the world. All things break. And all things can be mended. Not with time, as they say, but with intention. So go. Love intentionally, extravagantly, unconditionally. The broken world waits in darkness for the light that is you."
