Second Reading - Revelation 21:10, 22-22:55

And in the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb. The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates will never be shut by day and there will be no night there. People will bring into it the glory and the honour of the nations. But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practises abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him; they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever.






Prayer over the Gifts

THE FIRST READING ACTS 16: 9-15

As he walks on the beach near the city of Troas, Paul is on the western edge of Asia Minor. As he looks at the sun setting over the Aegean Sea, he is looking towards the edge of what would one day far in the future be called Europe.

This moment is immensely significant in Christian history. Paul is about to bring his story of Jesus Christ across these waters to a Europe that will one day take it to much of the rest of the world. In the morning he and his companions will take passage for the coast of Greece, to find their way eventually into the city

of Philippi. From this encounter will come one the most flourishing Christian communities Paul ever founded.

In this reading we are once again hearing the theme of all these post-Easter Sundays. Boundary after boundary is being crossed in the name of the Risen Christ.

PSALM 67

There is a statement in this song that makes a huge claim. "You(God) guide all the nations." This long ago society cannot conceive of God as being less than universal. Perhaps we need to ask ourselves if our concept of God is as large and inclusive as that of the poet who wrote these verses.

THE SECOND READING REVELATION 21:10, 22-22:5

"I saw no temple in the city for its Temple is the Lord God the almighty and the Lamb." John sees no "temple" - in our terms no church? - in his envisioning of the Holy City. But we should not see this as suggesting the church to be irrelevant. It is certainly a flawed and very human entity but it is far from irrelevant. We have but to follow John's gaze towards the throne of God to see the risen and glorified Jesus in the image of a Lamb. Jesus submitted, sacrificing himself to becoming human, even accepting death, so that the church might be given birth.

THE HOLY GOSPEL JOHN 14:23 -29

"Those who love me will keep my word", said Jesus. Heard casually, this sound gentle and soothing. After all the word "love" appears again and again. Yet if we listen carefully we realize this is a rather tough love. We're being told that the test of love is that it emerges in action and behaviour.

Jesus says, "We will come to them (who keep my word) and make our home with them." Jesus seems to be saying that faith in him - if it be sustained, genuine and grounded in action, becomes a relationship with him .

"I have said these things to you while...still with you. But the Holy Spirit...will teach you everything". Christian faith is a process. We are all being called to deeper maturity. John is saying to his contemporaries that while their focus has been and still is - on Jesus, this has to change. A spirit of holiness must now be found inside themselves. As you and I know, this is already true in our lives.

"I am going away and I am coming to you". It sounds paradoxical but it's the pattern of all our faith journeys. Faith comes and goes. I remember thinking of this verse while crossing to Lindisfarne across the wet sand after the tide had receded, allowing access to the island only to flood in again.
