## Welcome & Introduction

Presider As we gather in worship, we remember that  
God is community — Creator, Christ, and Spirit —  
ever moving in love.

We give thanks that we can gather on the traditional,  
ancestral, and unceded lands of the k<sup>w</sup>ik<sup>w</sup>ə<sup>ł</sup>əm  
(Kwkwetlem) First Nation.

We honour the q̓icəy̓ (Katzie) and other Coast Salish  
Peoples who have shared in the care of this land.

In gratitude and humility, we commit ourselves to truth,  
reconciliation, and right relationship —  
mirroring the divine dance of justice, love, and communion.



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
# The Breaking of the Bread


