 Let this house proclaim from floor to rafter: *Refrain*




Celebration of our Sacred Meal

Presider Glory and honour and praise to you, holy and living God.

To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favour upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus, the holy child of God.

Living among us, Jesus loved us.

He broke bread with outcasts and sinners,
healed the sick and proclaimed good news to the poor.




