
Fifth Sunday of Easter






- Love is the touch of intangible joy; love is the force that no fear can destroy; love is the goodness we gladly applaud: God is where love is, for love is of God.


Celebration of our Sacred Meal

Presider Glory and honour and praise to you, holy and living God. To deliver us from the power of sin and death and to reveal the riches of your grace, you looked with favour upon Mary, your willing servant, that she might conceive and bear a son, Jesus, the holy child of God.

> Living among us, Jesus loved us. He broke bread with outcasts and sinners, healed the sick and proclaimed good news to the poor. He yearned to draw all the world to himself yet we were heedless of his call to walk in love. Then, the time came for him to complete upon the cross the sacrifice of his life, and to be glorified by you.

On the night before he died for us, Jesus was at table with his friends. He took bread, gave thanks to you, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

Take, eat, this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine. and gave it to them, saying:

Take, drink; this cup is the new covenant in my blood, given for you and for all for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Now, gathered at your table, O God of all creation, and remembering Christ, crucified and risen, who was and is and is to come, we offer you our gifts of bread and wine, and ourselves, a living sacrifice.

Pour out your Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Body and Blood of Christ. Breathe your Spirit over the whole earth and make us your new creation, the Body of Christ given for the world you have made.

In the fullness of time bring us,

with all your saints from every tribe and language and people and nation, to feast at the banquet of the world. All this we ask through Jesus Christ.

By him and with him and in him,

in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honour and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever. **Amen.**

The Presider breaks the Bread and a period of silence is kept. The silence is broken with these words.


Presider	Lord, we died with you on the cross.
